

LOCAL LAW INDEX

2013

Local Law No. 1 of the year 2013 - A Local Law establishing the salary for the Office of County Treasurer for the four year term of office commencing January 1, 2014 and continuing through and including December 31, 2017.

Local Law No. 2 of the year 2013 – A Local Law authorizing an override of the Tax levy limit for Tioga County for 2014 and authorizing the adoption by Tioga County of a budget for 2014 that requires a tax levy that is greater than the tax levy limit for the 2014 fiscal year.

Local Law No. 3 of the year 2013 – A Local Law maintaining the current rate of taxes on sales and uses of tangible personal property and on certain services, and on occupancy of hotel rooms and amusement charges, pursuant to Article 29 of the Tax Law of the State of New York.

2014

Local Law No. 1 of the year 2014 - A Local Law providing for the collection of a hotel and motel tax in Tioga County.

2015

Local Law No. 1 of the year 2015 - A Local Law establishing the salary for the Offices of County Clerk and County Sheriff for the four year term of office commencing January 1, 2016 and continuing through and including December 31, 2019.

Local Law No. 2 of the year 2015 - A Local Law amending Local Law No. 2 of 1956 and Local Law No. 1 of 1963 with respect to the Reserve Fund for the Tioga County Self-Insurance Plan.

Local Law No. 3 of the year 2015 – A Local Law amending Local Law No. 1 of 2014 providing for the collection of a hotel and motel tax in Tioga County.

Local Law No. 4 of the year 2015 – A Local Law authorizing the use of Best Value Award methodology, in the competitive bidding process, for purchase contracts (including contracts necessary for the completion of a public works contract pursuant to (article 8) of the Labor Law) may be awarded on the basis of low bid or best value, as authorized by section 103 of the General Municipal Law and as defined in Section one hundred sixty-three of the State Finance Law.

Local Law No. 5 of the year 2015 – A Local Law of the County of Tioga, New York, allowing for common, safe items to be excluded from the dangerous fireworks definition as permitted by New York State Penal Law Section 405(b).
