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Mental health and crisis assistance:

<u>Tioga County Mental Health Clinic OPEN ACCESS - Also available for Drug and Alcohol Services and Assessments:</u> (607) 687-4000 between 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. or by calling the Tioga County Sheriff's Department at (607) 687-1010 after hours and weekends and requesting to speak to the on-call crisis worker.

OPEN ACCESS offers clients the ability to be seen "on demand" for any non-medical mental health service on a first come first serve basis. The goal is to eliminate any barriers for clients to access mental health services, whether it is unreliable transportation, childcare issues, or chaotic work schedules. Clients simply present to the Owego Clinic and request to be seen by the OPEN ACCESS provider. By offering the ability to be seen "on demand," the belief is that clients will be more likely to stay engaged and follow through with the treatment. Additionally, the clinic continues to offer 24-hour crisis coverage for clients experiencing g a mental health emergency via phone or walk-in.

Clients can walk in to the clinic Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. to see a crisis worker in person, or can call on the phone to speak to someone by calling the clinic at (607) 687-4000 between 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. or by calling the Tioga County Sheriff's Department at (607) 687-1010 after hours and weekends and requesting to speak to the on-call crisis worker.

Vivitrol Prescribers

Vivitrol is an opioid antagonist that is administered by a health care provider. It is a once a month injectable medication used along with counseling. It is not a narcotic and requires detox. Before starting Vivitrol, you must be opioid free for a minimum of 7 to 30 days to avoid serious consequences from opioid withdrawal.

Household Sharps Disposal Guidelines

Follow the below guidelines when storing sharps until they can safely be disposed of.

DO

- Place used Sharps in a sharps container. Containers can be purchased at the local drug store. If you do not have
 a sharps container use a plastic bottle that cannot be broken or punctured, such as a detergent bottle. Screw
 cap on & tape cap. Write "SHARPS" on the container. Bring to a designated drop-off location that accepts
 sharps.
- Place sharps in container directly after use. Keep container closed and away from children and pets. Store in a secure location.
- When traveling bring container with you.

DON'T

- Don't put sharps containers in the trash.*
- Don't clip, bend or put the cap back on used sharps
- Don't put loose used sharps or used sharps container in with the recyclables
- Don't put used sharps in soda cans, milk cartons, glass bottles or containers that can be broken or punctured. Coffee cans are not safe because plastic lids come off easily, leak and can be punctured.

Your insurance is required to provide the same benefit for this prescription as any other necessary prescription your doctor may write. So, whatever your standard copay is for prescriptions applies. You can get this prescription filled at any pharmacy.

Educational Rights of Children and Youth Experiencing Homelessness:

- The right to immediate enrollment in school, even if lacking paperwork normally required for enrollment.
- The right to attend school in his/her school of origin, if requested any feasible, OR in the school in the attendance area where the family or youth is currently residing.
- The right to receive transportation to his/her school of origin.
- The right to services comparable to those received by housed schoolmates, including transportation and supplemental educational services.
- The right to attend school along with children not experiencing homelessness.
- The posting of all homeless students' rights in all schools and other places around the community.
