## Preventing the Spread of COVID-19 in Election Polling Station Locations

## **Preventive Action Polling Workers Can Take**

- Stay at home if you have fever, respiratory symptoms, or believe you
  might be sick to help prevent to spread of the virus.
- Practice routine cleaning of frequently touched surfaces: including tables, doorknobs, light switches, handles, desks, toilets, faucets, sinks, etc.
- Since cleaning alone does not kill all germs, make sure to disinfect the surface as well after cleaning.
- Practice hand hygiene frequently: wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Clean and disinfect voting associated electronics (e.g., voting machines, laptops, tablets, keyboards) routinely using alcohol-based wipes or spray containing at least 70% alcohol to clean voting machine buttons and touch screens.

## Preventive action polling stations workers can take for themselves and the general public

- Ensure bathrooms at the polling station are supplied adequately with soap, water, and drying materials so visitors and staff can wash their hands.
- Provide an alcohol-based hand sanitizer
  with at least 60% alcohol for use before or
  after using the voting machine or the final
  step in the voting process. Consider
  placing the alcohol-based hand sanitizer
  in visible, frequently used locations such
  as registration desks and exits.
