

Select Your Battery To Learn How To Manage It*

Single-Use

These are disposable batteries designed to be used once and then discarded.

This type of battery cannot be recharged. Once it stops working, it won't power anything. Sometimes single-use and rechargeable batteries look similar. **Read your battery to determine what kind you have.**



Rechargeable

These batteries can be recharged and used multiple times, making them a cost-effective and environmentally friendly option. Common types include lithium-ion and NiMH, found in devices like smartphones, laptops, and cameras.



DDR

(Damaged, defective or recalled)

DDR batteries are typically lithium-based batteries (either single-use or rechargeable) that are bloated, are leaking, have burn marks and/or are part of a recall.
