WHAT WE DO

In over 30 years of operating, we have watched as the world of business has changed drastically. As an industry leader, TEAM Tioga has evolved and adapted to the new landscape.

Our mission, however, remains the same: to create jobs to strengthen the economic base of Tioga County; to increase the tax base to benefit Tioga County residents; and to sustain the quality of life to benefit Tioga County residents and attract out-of-county visitors.



STRATEGY

2022 HIGHLIGHTS

- The Tioga County Sustainability Department partnered with the towns of Newark Valley, Nichols, Richford and Tioga to provide electronic waste (E-Waste) collection to their residents. The County was able to facilitate over \$3,000 in savings by coordinating these events while also providing a more convenient service to our residents; 12,800 pounds of e-waste were recycled, and new partnerships were developed.
- The Tioga County Property Development Corporation acquired 13
 properties in the Temple and Liberty Street area in the Village of
 Owego. Ten blighted buildings were razed, properties were cleared
 of debris, and prepped for future residential development.
- The Tioga County Industrial Development Agency invested over \$1.9
 million to construct a water system on the southside of Owego. The
 newly constructed 242,263-gallon water tank and water main
 supports not only the recent Owego Square development of 93
 residential working family units, but also enhances water service
 to the adjacent pre-existing neighborhood and provides excess
 water capacity to support future development on the southside.
- The Tioga County Planning Department and Sustainability Office contracted with MRB Group to conduct a study around the solar industry in Tioga County. The study resulted in a Solar Best Practices and Policies document that was subsequently shared with all Tioga County towns and villages. The solar report was offered as a guide for municipalities when considering and negotiating with solar companies on proposed projects located within their jurisdictions.
- The 2022 publication of the Tioga County Education Workforce
 Report is an outcome of the priorities outlined in the 2020-2025
 Tioga County Workforce Development Strategy. The publication and
 distribution of the Report has resulted in an increased level of
 transparency about how each of our schools are addressing
 career/workforce programming. As well, there is increased
 transparency for businesses, which ultimately supports alignment
 between the schools and local employer needs.
- Tioga County Community Development included guidance and assistance for our local not-for-profits and municipalities. This aid resulted in 52 grant applications made, totaling approximately \$236,000.00 in new funds, to our community in 2022.
- The Economic Development Office assisted local businesses in accessing New York State grant funds. This resulted most significantly in a \$3.2 million award to Best Bev LLC, and a \$1.8 million dollar award to Fuddy Duddy's, among others.
- The Economic Development Office and Industrial Development Agency worked with the County GIS office to create a new web application that allows the public access to available development sites around the County. While other counties contract with an outside agency to provide this service, Tioga County created and will maintain the site in house.
- Tioga County Tourism (TCT) managed the implementation of the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) project Support the Creative Community in 2022. TCT was able to coordinate a group of local stakeholders, the Village of Owego and contractors to create new logo and sign plans that will lead to the installation of pedestrian and vehicular wayfinding signs to enhance the visitor experience in the historic business district. In addition, TCT was able to leverage the sign design services of the contractor for three other DRI projects to ensure consistent and coordinated signage throughout the Village.

The TEAM Tioga 2022 economic development strategy was a concerted effort by multiple partners coming together around a common goal. 2022 saw a welcome return to pre-COVID activity. TEAM Tioga kicked off the year with an event to mark the anticipated return to normalcy. The gathering brought together many stakeholders from around the region and highlighted recent wins, as well as a look ahead.



BROADBAND

The Town of Nichols was named one of four communities to take part in New York State's ConnectALL initiative, a program aimed at bringing affordable broadband internet access to rural communities across the state. The program is investing \$10 million to target areas where existing fiber will create a fiber bridge between large data centers (first mile) and individual homes (last mile), primarily in rural areas that are not serviced by private broadband providers. In the Town of Nichols, the capital funding provided by ConnectALL, along with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds provided by the Tioga County Legislature, and ARPA funds from the Town of Nichols, allowed Southern Tier Network (STN) to build a 35-mile open access, fiber-to-the-premise network to reach unserved and underserved households.

to guide future downtown development. This study was completed in 2022. The following are selected highlights from the analysis:

- making physical connections from the parks to downtown
- adding complete street elements to Broad Street
- developing design guidelines specific to downtown buildings.

WAVERLY MURAL PROJECT







TEAM Tioga participated in the planning to allow Waverly High School students to create a large-format mural using aluminum panels depicting the past, present and future of the Village of Waverly. This mural will be installed on Don Foote's building on Broad Street sometime in Spring 2023. The mural program continues to grow and inspire additional public art installations.

TIOGA COUNTY BEST PRACTIES AND POLICIES FOR SOLAR **DEVELOPMENT**

In 2022, Tioga County, in conjunction with MRB Group, developed a Municipal Best Practices and Policies for Solar Development report. This report serves as a resource for municipal officials to utilize when a solar developer proposes a project in Tioga County. It covers many topics, including: what to look for in a solar development project, how to balance a project with the protection of important farmland, how to handle PILOT agreement negotiations, etcetera. 239 REFERRALS

TEAM Tioga received thirty-two 239 Referrals for recommendations from municipalities in 2022. Highlights included a new gasoline station in the Town of Owego and the redevelopment of the former Glenmary Inn as an eating disorder clinic focused on adolescent females.



Other projects of note receiving a recommendation of approval from the Tioga County Planning Board included the Apalachin Dunkin Donuts rebuild to comply with floodplain regulations, and two solar projects in the Town of Owego.



SITE SELECTOR TOOL

TEAM Tioga developed a new tool for finding available commercial and industrial properties throughout the county. This web application highlights available vacant land and buildings that are either for sale or for lease in Tioga County. Developed in conjunction with the county's GIS department, TEAM Tioga's "Available Site Listings Tool" makes it easier for developers interested in coming to Tioga County to see what is available.

The site currently lists over 40 available properties, including both vacant land and buildings. The application allows users to click on sites for information, and links to a report about the property. Users can access the site listing tool on the ED&P and IDA websites under the "Resources for Site Selection" heading.

DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION INITIATIVE (DRI) PROGRESS

SHEAR PARADISE

Construction is nearly complete on the The Spa at Shear Paradise located at 127 McMaster Street in Owego. This 1,000 SF new addition is equipped with men's and women's locker rooms, relaxation area with hot tub, a steam room, and 3 treatment rooms, and will allow for 6-7 self-employed technicians to rent the space and provide a range of health and wellness services. DRI funding helped sustain and grow operations for this locally owned business. This project supported job growth, revitalization and expansion of a mixed-use property in downtown Owego.



HOME CENTRAL

Work is complete on the Home Central kitchen and bath design showroom, located at the corner of Fox and Central Ave (133 Central Avenue). Home Central transformed the former D&B Automotive building into a modern showroom and sales office, featuring the latest in kitchen, bath, window, and door designs. With home improvements on the rise across the country, the showroom and staff provide a unique opportunity for the community to add value to their homes, while stimulating the local economy.

MULTI-SITE PROJECTS FUND

In 2018, the Village of Owego was awarded \$10 million in New York State DRI funds. Since 2018, some DRI Multi-Site projects have not moved forward, and have since relinquished their funding. A fund was established in order to reallocate these relinquished funds. Starting in early 2023, the Tioga County Industrial Development Agency will accept Requests for Proposal from property owners within the DRI boundary in the Village of Owego for this Multi-Site Projects Fund.



CANDOR: NEW YORK MAIN STREET REVITALIZATION GRANT

In December 2020, the Tioga County Land Bank was awarded a New York Main Street Revitalization grant in the amount of \$500,000.00 to rehabilitate three buildings on Main Street in the Village of Candor. In 2022, construction on both the interiors and exteriors of the buildings took place. New siding was put on 82 and 84 Main Street. The storefront was reworked at 82 Main Street, including the installation of new storefront glass. Apartment renovations in all three buildings continue to take place as well. Upon completion, these buildings will provide residential and commercial space, including space for a market at 82 Main Street. Work is expected to conclude in the spring of 2023.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT





TEAM Tioga serves as a catalyst for economic and community development projects in Tioga County. Establishing relationships, building networks, making connections, and generating resources to meet the needs of Tioga County businesses, organizations, and residents are important steps in increasing economic prosperity. In 2022, TEAM Tioga focused its efforts on strengthening partnerships throughout Tioga County. Technical assistance was provided to organizations including, but not limited to, the following:

NICHOLS PARK, SPENCER

TEAM Tioga provided technical and grant writing assistance to the Village of Spencer, INSPIRE S-VE, and the Nichols Park Pond Beautification Committee in support of a trail restoration project at Nichols Park in the

Village of Spencer. Nearly 150 years after being established, this centrally located parkland remains free to the public as a recreational and environmental resource, hosting a range of events and activities such as fishing, kayaking, running, dog-walking, and observing wildlife. The safety of the full perimeter 0.6 mile stone dust trail had become a concern due to flood damage, poor drainage, grass encroachment, and constant usage. Sustainable, inclusive restoration will reflect ADA accessibility, intergenerational usage, and characteristics that allow individuals with a physical disability to enjoy the trail.



NEW YORK STATE SNOWMOBILE TRAIL GRANT PROGRAM

Five snowmobile clubs maintain 174 miles of New York State-funded snowmobile trails throughout Tioga County. TEAM Tioga writes and manages the NYS Snowmobile Trail Grant in support of the following five clubs each year:

- Tioga Ridge Runners Snowmobile Club
- Candor Valley Riders Snowmobile Club
- Ridge Riders Snowmobile Club
- Dryden Caroline Drifters Snowmobile Club

EMS STUDY

Under the guidance of the Office of Emergency Services, and with assistance from TEAM Tioga, consultants from the Center for Governmental Research recently completed a comprehensive Tioga County-wide EMS study. This report focused on how the EMS agencies that serve Tioga County are faring among the national and state trends, how the residents of Tioga County are being served by the existing EMS system, and what could be done to improve the EMS system.

TOURISM



2022 saw Tioga County Tourism (TCT) return to prepandemic operations, with a focus on promoting events and increased visitation. Through management of two USDA grants in partnership with ED&P, TCT continued to devote focus and funds to product development. TCT utilized funds from I Love NY to support 14 local events throughout 2022, as well as programs that included the Tioga County GeoTour, Finger Lakes Farm Country, the Haunted History Trail of New York State, Finger Lakes Wine Country, and ongoing digital campaigns.

EXPERIENCE TIOGA MOBILE APPLICATION

TCT continued to manage the Experience Tioga App, a free app that can be used on all iPhone and Android devices. Showcasing events, the app is a simple and efficient way for users to search for activities happening around the County. It includes all partner businesses, and allows users to choose places to visit and create maps in order to help plan their stay.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITY PROMOTION AND DEVELOPMENT

Acting as the lead agency, Carantouan Greenway was awarded a technical assistance grant from Design Connect, a student-run design organization based at Cornell University. TEAM Tioga worked with Carantouan Greenway, Design Connect, and a group of local stakeholders to begin planning an access point to the Chemung River and a new recreation area within the Village of Waverly. Design Connect conducted research on the target area, engaged the community in the planning process, and delivered a comprehensive plan that can be used to implement phases of this project in the future.

TCT also continued to work on the NYS Southern Tier Paddle Trail, a multi-county initiative with the goal of creating a regional paddle trail designed to position the region as a paddling destination. increase the customer base for existing businesses, and encourage new businesses, such as outdoor outfitters, to locate here.

SUPPORT THE CREATIVE COMMUNITY DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION WAYFINDING SIGN PROJECT

TCT was designated by New York State to manage the Creative Community Downtown Revitalization Wayfinding Sign Project. The main objectives are to create a new brand for the Village of Owego, oversee and fund renovations at the Tioga Arts Council, and create and implement a wayfinding sign system in the Village of Owego's Historic District. 2022 accomplishments included the development of a new logo and branding guidance for the Village of Owego, the completion of the Tioga Arts Council building capital improvements, coordination with multiple Village of Owego DRI projects to maximize design services, and the drafting of a comprehensive sign family and plan for the entire DRI area.

ONLINE SERVICES TECHNICAL SUPPORT GRANT

TCT was awarded a grant to implement a one-on-one technical assistance program to aid four small businesses in enhancing and adding digital sales, ordering and marketing to their existing brick-and-mortar operations. This program has been extended; partner businesses have made great strides in updating websites, enhancing social media marketing, and adding online ordering to their customer services.

RECRUITMENT WEBSITE

Work continues on the development of a website that is a "one-stop-shop" for information about living in Tioga County, NY that can be used as a tool for recruitment by multiple private and public employers and organizations. Video content and updated photos were shot in the summer and a video has been created that can be used as a marketing tool across multiple platforms. The website will launch in 2023.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

CANDOR EMS JUNIOR HEALTHCARE INITIATIVE

Candor EMS, in partnership with TEAM Tioga, secured Floyd Hooker Foundation funding in the amount of \$36,000.00 for Candor EMS to start a Junior Member program for students interested in the healthcare field. As a creative solution to the shortage of EMS and healthcare workers and volunteers in the area, students participating in the Junior Member program learn about career possibilities by completing training, guest speaker lectures, and hands-on shadowing during real ambulance calls.



TALENT SUPPLY TABLE

The Talent Supply Table initiative commenced in July 2022, bringing together the six public school districts in Tioga County, their three BOCES partners, and several other government and nonprofit actors to improve the workforce talent pipeline. This collaborative effort aims to identify work-based learning opportunities such as internships and job shadows, develop career pathways that link existing coursework to industry needs, and build connections between schools and businesses.


SHARED BUSINESS LIST

The Talent Supply Table, in collaboration with the Tioga County Career Center, has developed a shared list of local businesses open to offering student internships, job shadows, business tours, guest speaking opportunities, and hiring graduating seniors. At the end of 2022, over 50 local businesses and organizations have agreed to partake in preparing our future workforce.

STUDENT JOB BOARD

The Talent Supply Table also prioritized a centralized location where businesses can advertise opportunities to students. In 2022, Waverly Central School District, Greater Southern Tier (GST) BOCES, and Tompkins Seneca Tioga (TST) BOCES have all started using WBLOpportunities.com as a job board for students. Interested businesses can post student internships, full-time employment opportunities, volunteering opportunities, and more. Postings can be seen immediately by the public and any student in the Southern Tier. Additional schools will implement the website in 2023.

EDUCATION WORKFORCE REPORT



In November 2022, TEAM Tioga released its Education Workforce Report for the 2022-23 school year. The report highlights the County's education workforce strategy, the role of the Education Workforce Coordinator, and various classes offered by the county's six public school districts and three BOCES partners. In the report, businesses will find contact information for the school and BOCES staff that connect students with employers.



TIOGA COUNTY PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

(LAND BANK)



OWEGO APALACHIN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT PROJECT

The Land Bank, in partnership with the Owego Apalachin Central School District (OACSD), has developed a program that has junior and senior level students enrolled in the school district's Building Trades and Construction Systems Program. The students are rehabilitating a single-family home, acquired by the Land Bank, located at 103 Liberty Street in the Village of Owego. As a part of this program, students are learning technical skills in specialized areas of carpentry and cabinet making, residential wiring, plumbing, and heating. Training has occurred in machine operations, test equipment, hand tools, portable and stationary power tools, pneumatic tools, rigging, and OSHA Safety requirements. The project continues to provide hands-on experience in residential framing, door and window hanging, electrical wiring, heating systems, plumbing, siding, roofing, drywall installation, and interior/exterior trim. Blueprint reading, material codes, and specifications have also been extensively taught. The following tasks related to the program have been accomplished in 2022:

- Property was acquired in April 2022.
- Ribbon cutting ceremony was held in mid-May.
- Students renovated a bus to act as their mobile tool shop.
- LCP Group agreed to partner with the OACSD to work with the students on the demolition of a garage on the adjacent property.
- Building permit obtained.
- Internal demolition work began September 2022 and completed November 2022.
- Construction work began December 2022.

TEMPLE / LIBERTY STREET PROJECT -



The Land Bank has continued work on the large redevelopment project located on Temple and Liberty Streets in the Village of Owego.

- 10 structures were demolished in early 2022.
- 13 total properties secured for this project.
- The Land Bank is working with a housing developer to explore the feasibility of a 12-unit residential redevelopment project at these sites. The design of the proposed duplexes and triplexes will be consistent with the style and character of other residential structures in the surrounding neighborhood.



GRANT FUNDING -

The Land Bank applied for and received \$100,000.00 in operational funds per year for a three-year period from NYS Homes and Community Renewal through the Land Bank Initiative - Phase 1 program.

SUSTAINABILITY



The NYS EVolve program, administered by the New York Power Authority (NYPA), provides for the installation and management of Fast Charging EV stations within selected municipalities. The Tioga County Sustainability Manager reached out to NYPA to suggest five locations within Tioga County that fit the program criteria. NYPA has identified Tioga County's Courthouse parking lot in the Village of Owego as an ideal location for four Fast Charging EV stations. The cost to install and maintain the charging stations is provided by New York State.



In 2022, two solar fields went online in Tioga County. Both of these fields have a generating capacity of 4.98 megawatt and are located in the Town of Owego.

NYSERDA CLEAN ENERGY COMMUNITIES PROGRAM

Tioga County Sustainability applied for and was awarded \$5,000.00 from NYSERDA's Clean Energy Communities program. Those funds were used to create a Clean Energy Fund, which will be used to do all or some of the following:

- Upgrade County Office buildings lights to LEDs
- Convert gasoline powered lawn equipment to electric
- EV charging stations
- Install smart thermostats; lighting sensors, etc. for municipal buildings
- LED light bulb give away

This program will generate a reduction in energy costs as well as increase community awareness of the benefits of using clean energy and clean energy products. This is an ongoing fund; to date, an electric trimmer was purchased for Buildings & Grounds. These funds were awarded as a direct result of the Tioga County Planning Department holding a series of trainings for municipal officials.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE & ELECTRONIC RECYCLING

Household hazardous waste is unusable home and garden products, which contain hazardous chemicals. Examples are pesticides, fertilizers, household cleaners, oil-based driveway sealers, and pool chemicals. The improper use, storage or disposal of household hazardous waste may pose a risk to the health of humans, animals and the environment.

To reduce these risks, Tioga and Broome Counties have worked to include Tioga County residents in the use of Broome County's permanent Hazardous Waste Collection Facility. Wastes will be packed and shipped by trained personnel and disposed of in an environmentally safe manner.

In 2022, from 584 Tioga County residents, this program collected and properly disposed of 12.5 tons of household hazardous waste and 16.7 tons of electronic waste. TEAM Tioga also partnered with four towns, Newark Valley, Nichols, Richford, and Tioga to collect 6.4 tons of electronic waste. In 2023, partnerships will be expanded to include additional municipalities in order to collect even more electronic waste.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (IDA)









The Tioga County IDA administered the AB-017 E-Site Water System Capital Empire State Development (ESD) Grant and assisted coordination for the newly constructed water tank. The water system supports the new development of 93 residential units, enhances water service to the adjacent pre-existing neighborhood, and provides excess water capacity to support future development. Construction of the water tank required collaboration between TEAM Tioga, ESD, New York State Economic Development Council, R.B. Robinson Contracting, Statewide Aquastore Inc., Tioga County Department of Health, Owego Gardens Associates II LLC, Fagan Engineers, HUNT Engineers, Architects & Surveyors, and Veolia. The tank is completed, operational, and holds 242,263 gallons at the overflow.



LOANS: 2022

The IDA approved a \$162,500.00 IRP Loan for HeaHea Health + Healing Retreat. Loan funds will be used for the renovation of 537 Glenmary Drive in Owego, as well as equipment and furnishing purchases. Funds are contingent on final New York State approval for operation of the facility.



In 2022, there were 25 businesses making repayments on existing loans.

SUN EAST VALLEY SOLAR LLC

The IDA facilitated negotiations, prepared the Cost Benefit Analysis for a Financial Assistance Application received, and approved a PILOT Agreement for Sun East Valley Solar LLC.



RAYMOND HADLEY WATER CAPACITY FEASIBILITY STUDY

TCIDA applied for and was awarded an Empire State Development Grant in 2022 for a Water Capacity Feasibility Study. The study will investigate the most cost-effective option for increasing water capacity for Raymond Hadley Corporation, a dry food manufacturer and copacker which experienced over 20% growth during the past two years. Raymond Hadley Corporation utilizes a large amount of water each day to meet health and cleaning regulations. The sustainability of Raymond Hadley Corporation will enable future growth and support retention of approximately 60 jobs in the Village of Spencer, which is a Federal Opportunity Zone due to distressed attributes. The preliminary engineering and design cost estimate obtained from this study will provide a basis for pursuing additional funding and capital outlay.
