Tioga County COVID-19 Update for September 29, 2021 – October 5, 2021

COVID-19 case breakdown in Tioga County from September 29, 2021 – October 5, 2021:

• New Cases: 131

Unvaccinated: 48
Vaccinated: 50
Children Under 12: 20

Unknown Vaccination Status: 13

• Hospitalizations: 9

• Deaths: 0

Current Actives Cases: 180

Vaccination status is <u>self-reported</u> by the positive case or their parent/guardian during the case investigation. Several factors may affect one's protection against COVID-19 including which vaccine they received, how long it has been since they were vaccinated, and what precautions they are taking to protect themselves from COVID-19. The COVID-19 vaccine offers protection against severe illness and hospitalization. We encourage eligible individuals to get vaccinated.

As a reminder, anyone who is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, <u>regardless of vaccination status</u>, should stay home and get tested for COVID-19 to prevent further spread of the virus. If you are exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, please follow directions from your local health department regarding your quarantine. If you are fully vaccinated and have a known exposure, please wear a mask in public and take extra precautions for 14 days following your exposure.

COVID-19 Testing Recommendations:

- <u>Unvaccinated:</u> are encouraged to get tested 5 7 days after a known exposure, or if they are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19.
- <u>Vaccinated:</u> are encouraged to get tested 3 5 days after a known exposure, or if they are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19.
