FINANCIAL:

xpenditures are at 82.4% of the budget.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Two Probation Officers are attending Basic Peace Officer Training.
- Awarded 66 000 from DOJS Money should be received by the end of the month and will be used to purchase Pads.
- Incentives for Juvenile caseload purchased bowling bag and shoes.
- Modifying existing conditions of Probation Sex Offenders to require they register their devices which access the interpet with IPPC Technologies.

SHERIFF – Gary Howard:

FINANCIAL:

Revenues are at \$692,786 which is 86% of the budget. Expenditures are at \$12,034,956 which is 101% of budget due to deputies retro contracts and corrections retro contracts. Inmate boarders are at \$293,786 which is 196% of the budget.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Jail delly population for October was 42; there are 6 federal inmates and 2 board ins from other pounties.
- Litigation is still ongoing.
- A new eviction process is being implemented. Sheriff explained the new procedures in which we need to lock the place up to retain the contents.

OFFICE of EMERGENCY SERVICES – Mike Simmons:

FINANCIAL:

Budget is on track.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Communications Project:
 - Surveying has been conducted on the tower sites.
 - o Motorola VESTA phone system 2 laptops will be utilized for backup center.
 - XYBIX will be meeting with them and Motorola to determine installation; want to integrate furniture with consoles and new equipment to lessen disruption in Dispatch.
 - o Radio Tower site Ballou Rd. Theed to put a building and generator there. Motorola will design and get NYSEGs approval as they own the tower.
 - o Connect Tioga Dispatch to Broome County Dispatch will need to get with Jeremy.
 - Prospect Hill county owns the tower; it needs a driveway built. Prices are around \$30,000.
 May need to go to bid.
 - Spencer tower site boking at sharing the driveway. Director Simmons will talk with Attorney Languette.
 - Richford, South Apalachin and Nichols tower are progressing without any issues.
 - o Candor tower NYSEG power is not heavy enough to supply power to the new building. If the heating and AC turn on at the same time, we have to shut one down. Will need to have the power upgraded.
 - CAD Project State Police are starting to show a car on the map.
 - Candor EMS mobile data terminal mapping is not working yet.

EMS:

Curtis Hammand gave an update as he continues to work on a plan to improve EMS in the county.

- The northern part of our county is looking at 20-30 minutes response time or possibly 45 60 minutes, depending on where the ambulance is coming from.
- There's a trickle-down effect if we go with the other agency; Maine could not respond at all. Then we would rely on mutual aid. Have talked with Tompkins and Broome County. If you're contracted by a town to provide ambulance service to the taxpayers, they will say they paid to have this ambulance here and want it to stay in their area.
- It looks like down the road the county may need to buy an ambulance and put an ambulance service on. Talked with Niagara County and Chautauqua County which recently got an ambulance service.
- Fly cars are a temporary solution. Need to start looking at a 24/7 ambulance down the road funded by the county. Legislature Sauerbrey asked if you need a plan for a fly car or would that be part of

the mutual aid plan that we have now? Also, who would decide who is responding? Curtis stated we would just be added into the plan and Dispatch would decide who is going to respond.

- Municipal certificates were discussed.
- Director Simmons asked if we should start putting a plan together.
- The committee discussed how an ambulance study was done in the past.
- The cost of a new ambulance is \$240,000 and \$120,000 for equipment.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT:

Threat assessment – Corinne will be back in a month and she will worken this.

FIRE:

- No Chiefs meeting last month due to holidays.
- Shortage of volunteers is resulting in multiple fire departments being called to a fire. Working on a plan where dispatchers would automatically page staff for calls.

PERSONNEL:

Working with Personnel to revise the EMS Coordinator position to accurately reflect the job duties.

Public Safety Committee Meeting Probation Department Report February 6, 2024

Budget Status:

2024 Revenue Budget:

- \$960 of DWI Supervision fee collected in January. \$960 collected in 2024
- \$2,585.00 in restitution and surcharge collected in January. \$2,585.00 collected to date in 2024

Current Business:

- 1. Staffing One open Probation Officer I position remains unfilled. No applications have been received to date.
- Training Sydney Blinn and Briana Ward successfully completed their Basic Course for Peace Officer Academy on January 26, 2024. The academy included the Officers getting sprayed with pepper spray and completing a week of hands on Defensive tactics.
- 3. In December of 2023, Probation received a Reward Notice from the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) indicating Probation was awarded \$60,000 to spend toward the cost of providing Pre-Trial Services in Tioga County. Tioga County received the money in January. IT Director Loveland is in the process of ordering Ipads for each officer in the department as well as administrators and one to be shared by secretarial staff who attend court appearances with Supervisors and take notes. In addition, money has been designated for use of enhanced electronic monitoring systems, five years of payment for the internet service required for the Ipads, and gasoline for the vehicles used to attend court.
- 4. Individuals under supervision for a sex offense have begun enrolling in the newly mandated technology monitoring system provided by IPPC Technologies. Modifications of Conditions of Probation (COPs) have been completed on those already being supervised and newly sentenced individuals are having that condition included on their COPs.
- 5. Quality Assurance (audit program). Admin Staff at Probation have developed a rough draft of the Quality Assurance Program which will be put into place by June of 2024. Admin staff have reviewed multiple plans from various Probation Departments around the state and created a program which should work well in Tioga County. Admin staff will continue to refine the program during the coming months.
- 6. Two Probation Officers and one Probation Assistant has been assigned to complete the Pre-Sentence Investigation regarding Mr. Boyd Fenton, who on January 29, 2024 plead guilty to Arson, Assault, and 30 counts of torturing animals in connection with the fire at Tioga Downs Racetrack and Casino in 2023. This will be a huge assignment with many man hours designated to the restitution portion of the investigation.

7. Juvenile Delinquency Services:

January of 2024- There was no Juvenile Delinquency Appearance Ticket (JDAT) received for the month of January.

YTD: 0 JDATs received to date.

- E- Connect: To date, -- youth have been screened in 2024. As a result of the E-Connect screenings, --- youth were found to be below threshold and not in need of an immediate mental health referral. --- youth were found to be a level II and were referred for a mental health evaluation. --- youth were found to be a level III and agreed to schedule an appointment at TCDMH. --- youth were also determined to be a level I which required immediate mental health intervention.
- There are no youth currently in juvenile sex offender treatment.

ATI Programs:

- <u>Electronic Monitoring</u> There are currently three individuals being monitored via the VCheck24 phone app, GPS electronic monitoring system, and AlcoTag systems.
- <u>Community Service</u> WWP is up and running effectively. The District Attorney's Office
 has included WWP in plea agreements where it is possible to maintain the program.
 WWP is also being used as a graduated sanction on Probation Violations.
- <u>Pre-Trial Release</u> There are 20 people being supervised via the Pre-Trial Release program

Court Ordered Investigations: 55 active investigations for Tioga County courts (Criminal, Family and Surrogate)

Supervision: 180 cases ordered by Tioga County courts & Family Court (includes JD Diversion cases)

Violation of Probation petitions: 14 defendants/respondents have violation petitions pending against them in criminal & family court.
